Beloved Zion,

April 17th is the expected last frost date for Union this year. If I am going to start seeds six weeks out. I will have till the end of February to have everything in place. I could start seeds early **PASTOR** and risk needing to re-pot multiple times which would not only give me more work, but it also disturbs the roots. I could start later, but this might mean missing out on the full growing season. But I also know, that if I am not careful, if I do not start planning, getting things ready, setting up my grow lights, mixing potting soil, checking seeds, ordering more, mapping out my garden, considering watering needs, and my schedule down the road.

I enjoy gardening. It's something my family has always done. Both as a kid growing up, and now as an adult with a family of my own. This will be my third growing season at our house. Each year I have scraped away sod to make beds, find where the sunlight shines, and found new areas to grow. This year will be no different. I am excited to start growing. Here in the later winter weeks, long before I will plant anything in the ground, the work begins.

Long before we ever see the fruits of our labor does our work begin. In the life of the church, we must never forget to tend to the soil. Anytime we seek to grow our church, it will mean focusing on some root work. Tending seeds well before they are planted in the garden. Planting seeds that might not make it. Planting seeds that we might give away. It will mean doing some planning, and figuring out where the sunlight will shine. It will mean experimenting and trying some practices or plants. Maybe it means we will talk to neighbors. Sometimes it means finding ways to fend off aphids or groundhogs. And we will also be aware that sometimes, some plants don't fruit. Maybe a late frost hit them. Maybe you over prune. Or they flower too later for pollinators to get to them. Not everything will turn out the way you hope, but that doesn't mean the work you did wasn't worth it.

I didn't fall in love with gardening picking tomatoes or strawberries growing up. I fell in love with gardening dragging my finger in the soil and getting ready to plant carrots. I fell in love with going out every evening to water with my father. I fell in love with picking up the good apples and boiling and grinding and canning with my mother. This is the discipline of faith. It's finding enjoyment in the everyday practices of faithfulness. It's doing the good that is yours to do. It's about building relationships even if they won't last forever. I love Candlelight Christmas Eve services and communion on Maundy Thursday. I love baptisms and new members. But I also love challenging council meetings where people are honest, passionate, and yet kind. I love opening a blank Word document week after week and facing the challenge of writing something new. I love getting to know funeral directors as we give the family time alone with their deceased loved one. I love setting up chairs, making coffee, and checking if doors are locked. I love clearing my



shared a post on what happens when we do away with hymnals. I know we aren't looking toward that soon, but I was curious. According to the post by Joseph Gilbert of the group Great Hymns and Songs of Faith:

- Hymns in hymnals have been carefully vetted.
- Hymnals are a great reference, but they also contribute to learning hymns from memory to pull from in personal life.
- Hymnals allow us to sing in harmony.
- The diversity of the hymns and cultures represented that are included in most hymnals.
- Hymnals provide liturgical structure and theological education.
- Hymnals are accessible for all ages.
- Hymnals allow for more congregational involvement.
- Hymnals can be used for personal use as well as community use.
- Hymnals provide spontaneity.
- Hymnals were traditionally used to help with music literacy and continue to do so.
- Hymnals are familiar and comfortable. We have a treasure sitting right in the backs of our pews, which I, for one, took for granted. This is a wonderful reminder of the tools we have to

Make heart-shaped crayons as a reminder that the things of God should be written on our hearts.

What you need:

- An adult to help
- Oven
- Oven mitt
- Heart-shaped silicon mold (available at craft stores)
- Old crayons

What you do:

- 1. Heat oven to 230 degrees.
- 2. Remove paper wrappers from crayons. (This is easier if you soak crayons in cool water first.)
- 3. Break crayons into small pieces. Place pieces into heart-shaped mold, filling them about two-thirds full.
- 4. Bake for 15 minutes or until crayons have completely melted.
- 5. When the heart-shaped crayons are cool, remove them from the mold.



In 2022 Missouri's power supply was produced by 12 per cent renewable energy.

Wind power contributes about ¾ of Missouri's renewable energy.

66% of Missouri's electric power is generated from coal. Missouri is in fourth place among all states for coal produced electricity. Only a small percent of coal used, is mined in Missouri. Missouri is the second largest bio- diesel producing state.

Missouri ranks 27th in per capita energy consumption.

The average Missouri household consumes 100 million BTU's of household power each year. That is 12 steps higher than the U.S. Average.
