Beloved Zion

Toward the end of May, I attended a town hall meeting, here in Union hosted by Missouri Main Street Connection and the new (Re)Discover Union initiative. The Missouri Main Street Connection is part of a national coalition of non-profits, PASTOR

Street Connection is part of a national coalition of non-profit whose work helps local communities reinvest in their community. By supporting, celebrating, and

organizing the community, Mainstreet hopes to impact the town's economic well-being and sustainability positively. This 2-hour town hall was a chance to meet other interested community members, introduce the community to the initiative, and start preliminary feedback for this 2-year program.

In the first part of the meeting, we introduced ourselves. People shared why they were there and what they hoped for. Community members, owners of local businesses, members of the non-profit, and members of the new initiative, all shared similar concerns and hopes. I hear so many people talk about parking, nobody showing up downtown anymore, and what it used to be. I heard hopes from businesses working together. Questions about housing, and hosting events. Sentiments like, if people would just walk through the door, or drive downtown they might learn how great some places are. I heard so many people talk about how long they lived in Union. How much they loved it growing up, and how they hope to get some of that back. So many people want to preserve what we can, while also making way for what new things can happen.

What I found fascinating; was how familiar the conversation was. When the owner of the Great Eight Cinema, said "Come back to the movies" it struck a chord with me. His tone was the same tone I have heard in every church I have ever been to. The building, the members, and the pictures on the walls all witness the quiet disappointment of things not being what they used to be.

During the meeting, it was told to us by Main Street Missouri, that no one was coming to save us, which is, ironically, good news. No one is coming, which means we do not need to wait to be saved. We can save ourselves. Things might not be what they once were. But that's life. It changes. Main Street spoke about self-help, but they also talked about building on what you already have. By celebrating the people in the room rather than blaming those who left. That spoke about small steps. With incremental yet comprehensive change. You cannot change everything all at once. But if you take a wide approach, focus on quality, step by step, and if you find some good partners along the way, we will build a sustainable future. Union is the fastest-growing city in Franklin County. Downtown Union has begun a new initiative. We have been a leader in this community for over 100 years. Our futures are tied together. 122 years ago, we decided to place ourselves in the heart of town. 60 years ago, we decided to renovate rather than relocate. 30 years ago, we made the same decision. In 2024, there are no plans of moving. But there is a

Notes from the Music Director

On Pentecost, the Chancel Choir sang an upbeat, joyous piece called African Psalm. By

Victor Johnson, this arrangement is taken from a Zambian folk song. It incorporates a very common musical form used in many African cultures: call and response, which is a musical conversation in which a soloist or group makes a musical "statement", and a group responds with a repeated "statement" (in this case, either an echo or "Hallelujah")—adding the percussion results in an upbeat, positive statement of singing to the Lord and giving Him praise.

Throughout my music teaching career, I began to appreciate West African musical traditions, especially the use of music and dance as a societal celebration. Music IS socialization. Children grow up learning various percussion styles from drum masters and harmonizing a Capella from song leaders and griots (storytellers of the oral tradition).

But I was never so touched by this style as I was about 12 years ago when I first heard the African Children's Choir at a conference. The organization was started 38 years ago, and it focuses on providing a musical outlet for those children who lost their parents through war, famine, and disease. What moved me to tears the most was the children's absolute joy in their voices. No matter their circumstances, they sang to lift their mood and celebrate what they did have. That's the beauty of music and utilizing music to provide a bridge from despair to joy.

JOY Adult Education Discussion Class




