Beloved Zion,

Very few things are made worse by going for a walk. Are you having a good day? Go for a walk. You might notice how beautiful things are. Are you having a bad day? Go for a walk. You might notice how beautiful things actually are. Short walks, long walks, hot and sweaty, nice and leisurely, it doesn't matter; I rarely regret walking

somewhere. I do some of my best thinking while walking. I have made some of my most important decisions while walking. There is something about being outside, with the sun shining, the fresh air, and the moving of my body that helps bring clarity to what is going on. Caeligh and I were on a walk when we decided to entirely change our wedding plans due to Covid in 2020. It was walking along the river in Washington during my interview weekend here at Zion in which I came to a decision. When I am overwhelmed, when I have writer's block, when I am listless, when I want to savor a moment, I usually end up taking a walk. Sometimes alone, but more and more these days with a kid or two in tow.

Throughout the Gospels, Jesus often travels on foot from one place to another. Occasionally he is on a boat. And there was that one time he rode on an animal. The rest of the time he is walking. During his last week, Jesus and his disciples stayed in Bethany or the Mount of Olives, rather than Jerusalem. Every morning Jesus would have a few miles to walk before he reached the temple. Every evening Jesus would take his 30-40-minute walking commute back out of town.

I like to think the reason Jesus stayed in the towns outside of Jerusalem was not because he didn't have a place to stay in Jerusalem. I like to think that the walk helped clarify, center, and calm him as he lived out his call in what had to be a stressful time. I imagine his cursing the fig tree, and all the talk about stones toppling over during his walks with his disciples gave him time to process, imagine, and vent even as his passion kept him preaching his message of radical love, justice, and peace.

So, it doesn't matter if it's down the hall a few times, or all over town, or even a drive with the windows down, with no errands to run. When the world gets a bit overwhelming. When you have a bunch of good energy you don't know what to do with it. When you don't know what to do next, or what the next right thing is. Trying to go for a walk. Very few things are made worse by going for a walk.

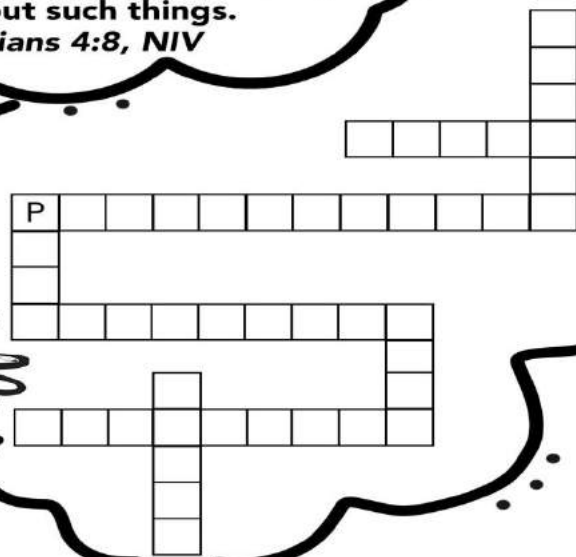

'Children of Peace' Sculpture

A year or two after three flag poles with three flags had been erected – one to the left for the United Church of Christ, middle is the United States of America, and one to the right is the Missouri flag. Behind these were planted nine evergreen shrubs.

In February 2023, a committee was formed by the Church Council to erect a sculpture. They appointed a committee – Skip Buehrle, chair, Sandy Stierberger, Barbara Harvey, and Arlene Hogan. On July 2023, the council approved the design and the sculpture (Children of Peace) for a cost of \$53,333. The cost of the project was paid for from the Henrietta Schuenemeyer Memorials and other miscellaneous donations. The actual sculpture was done by Gary Lee Price (Alchemy Arts, LLC) in Springville, Utah. Work began in September 2023.

Hired companies involved in the project were: Bob Seaton (backhoe), DJS Masonry Work, Harold Blankenship (rock hauling), Dennis Sullentrup (bricklayer). Volunteer workers were Skip Buehrle, Carl Rosenkoetter, Charlie Schuenemeyer, Bruce Templer, Brad Parker, Dennis Tucker, and Alan TenEyck.

In November 2023 following the Sunday worship service, the sculpture was dedicated and led by Rev. Knoblauch at the sculpture site.

Hurricane Beryl Response

On July 7, 2024, Hurricane Beryl hit the Texas coast as a Category 1 hurricane, causing significant damage and power outages. CWS' Emergency Preparedness, Response and Recovery (EPRR) team quickly mobilized to support affected communities by distributing Emergency Cleanup Buckets, Blankets, Hygiene Kits, and Period Packs through our partners. CWS also secured temporary housing for an unaccompanied child and their sponsor.

Thanks to the contributions from our congregation, we helped provide critical resources and continue support long after the initial disaster response. The ongoing collaboration with Reach Out America in Pearland, TX, has been essential in distributing supplies to those in need. Your generosity ensured families have the comfort and tools needed to begin the cleanup process.
