#### **Beloved Zion,**

When Caeligh and I bought our house, the water heater was older than me. A "long" hot shower was five minutes. You could have a warm shower for another 5 minutes. Plenty of times when family would stay with us, strategic showers were a necessity. By the time summer would come around you didn't notice it all that much. But after our second

winter in the house, we decided it was time. In February, we got a new water heater after nearly two years in the house. The plumber came, installed the tank, and one afternoon we had as much hot water as we needed. Special thanks to Alan TenEyck who helped us properly wire it. The plumber helped me move the old tank to the garage. And there it sat. For months. And months. I knew I could take it to the recycling center. It's not even a five-minute drive. All I had to do was take out the car seats, load it up, and drive on over. And yet it sat there for months, kinda in the way.

A couple of weeks ago, my dryer broke. The heating element died. It too, long out served its expected timeline. We were told it was broken when we bought the house. But for two and a half years it dried clothes, so we didn't replace it. We bought a replacement, and had it set to be delivered the next day. There was a \$50 removal fee for the old dryer. I opted out. Instead, during the kid's nap time, Caeligh and I disconnected the dryer, and moved out our back door. As we went to load it up into the car, we heard some rattling. Removing a few screws, and over \$6 in change later, the dryer was in the car, and I was on my way to the recycling center. 10 minutes later, I was loading up the water heater.

I don't know why I couldn't get around to it. It wasn't a big task. It wasn't hard or inconvenient. Part of me knows, there was a little fear. I hadn't gone to the recycling center. What if they wouldn't take it? What's the worst that could happen? I would have to put the water heater back in my garage and figure something else out. My worst-case scenario is having a broken water heater in my garage. I lived with the worst-case scenario for 6 months.

How much are we willing to hang on to things that do not serve us anymore before we do something about it? How many outdated, broken, or simply worn-out ideas, practices, or customs are we still storing? Unfortunately, recycling an old appliance is a lot easier than beliefs and habits.

Welcome to the Fall Clear Out. Unlike a Spring Clean, where you freshen up the house, open the windows, clear out cobwebs, and let your space breathe a little. The Fall Clear Out is our preparation to make space. To remove the things that get in our way. That will not serve us through the winter. That is just taking up space. As we enter the fall season, our theme will be "Into the Deep". Inspired by the theme of the next General Synod, we will journey through our scriptural tradition is the searching and teaching of wisdom. As

minds, and we make our choices based on our own particular values and priorities.

Even though many issues deserve our attention, the Green Team wants to encourage you to consider how we care for God's earth as well. When it comes to the environment and the myriad challenges we face, there are many things we can do as individuals and communities: recycling, planting natives, buying energy efficient or electric vehicles, installing solar panels. But many of the problems are so huge that we also look to our government, because it can work on the scale and scope necessary. This means we need to elect leaders who are willing to have difficult discussions and make hard

choices for the good of our nation and the world.

**During September and** October, the Green Team will be distributing

Climate Hope Pledge

Cards. The pledge is

simple: "I pledge to vote as an act of hope for present and future generations."

United Church of Christ congregations will be using these pledge cards to invite members to join others in working for a sustainable and just world. A nationwide art contest for children and youth earlier this year gathered over 400 entries from children as young as 3 years old. 

Audit Committee- Fern reported we have a full committee-Ken Rohrbach, Sue Leicht, Sallie Hancox, and Cindy Groenke have agreed to serve.

Personnel Review Committee-A meeting has been scheduled for Thursday, June 20.

Leadership Development Committee-B.J. Cooper has agreed to serve. Maxine Harrison will complete her second term and will go off the council. Bruce Templer and Fern Dewert have agreed to a second term.

Building and Property Committee- Alan TenEyck and Dennis Tucker will present details of the Masonry restoration bid to the congregation at the Special Congregational Meeting on June 23, 2024.

Safety Committee- Review of the Fire drill was "It went well".

Hansen Committee-Will meet in June and the committee is feeling confident about the sight and sound choices which will cover the entire building.

The Special Congregational meeting will be held on Sunday, June 23 in the Sanctuary to discuss and approve the bid for tuck pointing the church. The vote will be a written ballot.


# Rummage Sale Thank You!
