Beloved Zion,

Grace and Peace to you from God our Creator, Christ our Redeemer, and the Holy Spirit our Sustainer. Our Lenten journey is set before us. Before we gather this coming Ash Wednesday, I want you to consider how you're preparing for the journey. Like any trip, we need to plan. For some,

they will plan to "play it by ear", or to "go with the flow". For everyone who doesn't want to plan, I have good news. I have you covered. I will be leading all of the worship services, showing up or tuning in you will be covered. For those who want to be a little more involved in their journey, I have some resources. This year, following the work of A *Sanctified Art*, we will be God **in** the midst of extremes.

This year's theme is "Everything In Between." This theme "invites us to navigate the polarities in our lives with more faith, intention, and openness to be transformed." Intention & action, stranger & neighbor, faith & works, rest & growth, lost & found, righteousness & mercy, shouting & silence, power & humility, acceptance & resistance, grief & hope. As we prepare to go on this journey, the themes will help us explore nuance and wisdom as we challenge the binary and imagine where we meet God everywhere [in] between. Perhaps one of these pairs sticks out. Perhaps you have your own. I suggest you make one your theme for all of Lent, particularly if you are caught in the tension between two extremes in your life. How might we hold the tension tenderly enough to neither wear ourselves out nor lose our grip? Each week, there will also be a time of reflection. On Wednesday in both the morning and the afternoon, I will lead a guided conversation on our journey progress.

Notes from the Music Director

This past winter wasn't very kind to our Wednesday music

Music Director events. Chancel Choir had to cancel rehearsal three times, but the members rallied by singing select hymns for our church offerings. As I'm watching the melting snow drip off the deck, I'm reminded about the spring just around the corner. Spring brings rebirth as well as contemplation with the beginning of Lent.

There is one piece Chancel Choir loves that we are determined to sing: an arrangement that includes *Down to the River to Pray*. It's a simple yet haunting melody. For me, it reaches the basic part of my soul that just longs to go off into nature and sit—sit and pray, sit and meditate—to try to make sense of this crazy world of ours.

According to the Mormon Tabernacle Choir website, *Down to the River* has been known as a spiritual, hymn, and Appalachian song. Some even believed it originated as a Native American Tribal song that later had Christian lyrics added. Like any folk song, origins are fuzzy.

However, according to the United Methodist Church discipleship website, this tune was found in the first collection of folk songs and was titled *The Good Old Way* and included the phrase "down to the valley to pray." This book, published in 1867, was considered a primary source for African American songs. The webpage segues to a section that describes how the "valley" was replaced by a place for baptism-a river. Some other historians speculate the song was a "signal" song to give code for slaves to escape. Of course, the song was made famous a couple of decades ago by Allison Kraus in **O Brother Where Art Thou.**

The choir and I look forward to sharing this beautiful melody with you soon.

Zion UCC Church Council Meeting January 20, 2025

Zion UCC Church Council met on Monday, January 20, 2025. Those present were Bruce Templer, Kathy Reed, Rev. Nick, Brad Parker, BJ Cooper, Fern Dewert and Connie Thompson. Donna Bocklage, Paul Brinker and Barb Cox were unable to make the meeting. Connie opened the meeting with prayer and President Fern Dewert called the meeting to order.

A Covenant of Leadership was read together. Standing Committee assignments for 2025 are as follows: Audit – Fern; ByLaw Revision – Kathy; Leadership Development – Brad; Personnel – Donna; Properties – Paul; Security/Safety – Bruce; Membership Review – BJ; Finance – Barb.

Fern received a letter from Susan Merlino who has resigned from the Church Council. We thank her for her time on the council. Names were suggested and will be given to Carl Rosenkoetter (Leadership Development Chair) to replace the 2 years left on Susan's term.

Consensus Agenda

- Minutes of the December 2024 Church Council – approved
- Pastor's Report for December approved
- Minister to Youth & Families Report for December – approved

- Zion Fellowship will host a brunch on February 9th during the Intergenerational Sunday School hour.
- Financial Reports for December approved.
- At the December meeting the question was raised about the telephone/internet expenses. Connie explained that some months two bills may have been paid rather than one.
- In 2024, the Eastern Association expense of \$120 was not paid; therefore a total of \$240 will be paid to the Eastern Association in 2025 which will include the 2024 amount.
- Council expressed thanks to the members of the Finance Committee for their expertise in investing the finances of the church.
- Next council meeting will be on Monday, February 17, 2025 at 7:00 p.m.

Discussion Agenda

With the resignation of Susan Merlino who was the Recording Secretary, Connie has volunteered to serve as the Recording Secretary of the Church Council.

The 'draft' of the Congregational Agenda for the February 2025 meeting was reviewed with additions being added under Old Business.

A proposal to have an 'AED Oversight Program' was reviewed by the council. This program will help us to keep in compliance with our AED – providing maintenance checks, receiving notifications from the company to check our AED when needed and much more. It was approved to purchase an AED Maintenance program for 1 year for \$125.

The Finance Committee presented a proposal to the council as follows: Place \$225,000 in a 2 year Edward Jones CD paying 4.10%. This will generate an additional \$9,250 (approximately) per year for 2 years and allow for diverse timing of maturing dates. We will have the flexibility to pay for any Fellowship Hall repair costs from other maturing CDs in 2025. Note: \$50,000 will be taken from the excess balance in the general fund checking account at United Bank and \$175,000 will be taken from the Money Market checking account at Edward Jones.

Additional flower arrangements will be made for the fellowship hall tables. Approval was given to pay for the expenses from the undesignated Memorial Fund checking account.

Connie reported that St. Jordan UCC gave a monetary donation in December for the Good Samaritan Fund. A thank you note will be sent to the St. Jordan Congregation.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.
