Beloved Zion,

The bark of my sycamore is starting to shed. The solstice has come, and it is time for new growth. What has started with a few flakes here and there will soon become a mess that will convince you the tree is dying. But it's nothing to worry about. As the tree grows, it lets go of that which used to protect it in order to thrive. As we enter the heat of summer, when growth

is abundant, we are at our best, when we give ourselves space to grow by letting go of the things that no longer serve us.

Letting go of the protective layer can seem risky. It seems vulnerable to shed its bark. Yet it would be riskier not to. A congregation, as a community, as a country, what do we need to let go of? What ideas, practices, or values do we need to shed to welcome a thriving life? When we talk about growth and change, it's easy to demean or condemn what has been. Some things serve us well for a particular season of our lives. But they were always meant to be temporary. Just because something is temporary doesn't mean they are not beautiful, loving, or useful. We need to let go of some ideas and practices, not because they weren't good for us, but because they are no longer needed. By the way, the rummage sale is coming up soon.

By letting go of that which no longer serves us, and letting go of any guilt or shame of what was, we are able to focus our time and attention on the tasks at hand. Of building up the Kingdom of Heaven, right here, right now. But these current times might unnerve us. They may get us thinking that we still need to cling to the former ways. When my anxiety gets the best of me, I am often reminded by a poem by a Kentucky Farmer.

Wendell Berry, in "The Peace of Wild Things," writes... "When despair for the world grows in me and I wake in the night at the least sound in fear of what my life and my children's lives may be, I go and lie down where the wood drake rests in his beauty on the water, and the great heron feeds. I come into the peace of wild things who do not tax their lives with forethought of grief. I come into the presence of still water. And I feel above me the day-blind stars waiting with their light. For a time I rest in the grace of the world, and am free."

So as this season of growth arrives, go and rest in the grace of the world, and consider what you need to leave behind. I know it's getting hot, so find some shade, bring some water, wear your sun block, all those good things, and may you find the peace of wild things.

Zion UCC Church Council Meeting – May 2025

Zion United Church of Christ met on Tuesday, May 20, 2025. Those present were BJ Cooper, Norma Kern, Donna Bocklage, Barb Cox, Bruce Templer, Kathy Reed, Fern Dewert, Rev. Knoblauch and Connie Thompson. Brad Parker and Paul Brinker were unable to attend the meeting.

Fern opened the meeting with prayer and called the meeting to order.

Consensus Agenda:

- Minutes of the April Church Council meeting were approved.
- Pastor's Report
 - Vacation dates are from June 16-22 (not May 16-22)
 - 'Viewing' dates for those who would like to participate virtually in the General Synod activities will be held at church and will be published in the Sunday announcements.
- Minister to Youth & Families report was approved.
- April financial reports were approved.
- Time/Date for next council meeting will be on June 16 2025 at 7:00 p.m.

Discussion Agenda:

Hansen Trust – Zion was notified by the Hansen Trust that the church will receive \$1.6 million by the end of May 2025. The will stipulates that this gift should be used for 'general charitable purposes'. Dates for 'Round Table' discussions will be held following the morning worship service on Sundays, July 20 and August 24, 2025 in the Fellowship Hall. The Finance Committee made a recommendation to the council that when this gift is received to deposit the gift in the Money Market account at Edward Jones until investments strategies are fully explored. Motion was made and approved to follow the recommendation of the Finance Committee.

Finance Committee – Met with Tricia Seeley from Edward Jones about long-term investing.

Personnel Review Committee – The committee reviewed the employee handbook and has created a 'draft' copy for review by the committee.

Building & Property Committee – No update on the renovations to the fellowship hall. A workday was held with minor projects being done. A new sidewalk on the north end of the church will be done to replace the pavers that are currently there.

Safety Committee – Waiting for a bid for new security cameras for the church.

Building/Contents Inventory – They will be meeting on May 22nd to begin the inventory of the contents of the church.

Other Business:

Motion was made and approved to allow up to \$500 to purchase a sound board cover for the new sound system and a portable iPad to be able to adjust the sound board remotely.

The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.

Special Congregational Meeting – June 1 2025

A special congregational meeting of Zion UCC was held on Sunday June 1 2025 following the morning worship service in the sanctuary.

The purpose of the meeting was to notify the congregation of the final settlement in the Hansen Trust.

Four years ago after the death of Robert E. Hansen, Zion UCC was notified that Zion was named in the Trust. The initial gift of \$100,000 was used for improvements to the back door of the church and for upgrades to the audio/visual system. At the final settlement of the Trust, Zion would be one of 3 equal beneficiaries of the remaining funds.

At the beginning of May 2025, Zion received a letter from the trustees that informed us that distributions would be made to the beneficiaries to be completed by May 30. Zion's share would be \$1.6 million. After consultation with the Finance Committee, President Fern Dewert signed the Waiver, Reimbursement and Release of Trustees document on May 9 2025.

The trust stated that one equal share shall be paid to Zion UCC to be used for "general charitable purposes."

The IRS definition of "general charitable purposes" was shared.

The Finance Committee has met with representatives of 2 investment firms to explore investment strategies. On May 9th the Finance Committee was informed of the \$1.6 million gift and recommended it be placed temporarily in the Edward Jones Money Market account currently earning approximately 4% interest until final decisions are made regarding the use of these funds. This recommendation was approved by the Church Council on May 20 2025.

On Wednesday May 25 2025, Zion received a check for the \$1.6 million which was immediately deposited in the Money Market account.

To begin the process of determining how this gift would be used the Finance Committee and Church Council decided on having round table discussion to hear the congregation's ideas. The discussions will be on Sunday July 20 2025 and Sunday August 24 2025 in the Fellowship Hall following the morning worship service.
