When we walk by someone in a store, at the gas station or even in churches, we don't really know what struggles people are dealing with.

Unexpected injuries or surgery. Job loss.

Rebuilding lives after years of addiction or serving prison time. Families dealing with cancer treatments. Keeping electricity on, a roof over their head, or heating and cooling needs are a few examples how we make an immediate impact. All of them live in the Union School District.

We provide help to everyone who comes to The Good Samaritan. As a committee we understand we cannot fully fix some situations. We are then able to help ease a portion of their needs and direct them to other available resources in our community. For a small town there truly is a lot of need here.

Our congregation created this signature resource to strengthen our community, and we ask for your help in continuing this fine service. Zion gave us a generous increase in our annual budget this year and we've been very careful to stretch it as far as possible to help as many as possible. We're grateful when memorials come in that allow us to continue this work. At this time our funds for this year are depleted. ended each year with a surplus. This surplus helps earn income from investments. With the fabulous work of our Finance Team, the Church Council, the Audit Committee, the input from all the committees when preparing the annual budget, congregational oversight of the budget, and most importantly, the generous donations from all of you, we are in a wonderful financial position. The position gives us the ability to dream and discern when it comes to the bequest from Bob Hansen. What new ministry might we seek to accomplish in our church or in our community? Which brings us to the round table discussions we have had.

At this, most of you have learned about the trust and the round table discussions. At the end of July and the end of August, I facilitated a conversation with all who showed up. My goal for the time we spent together was not to decide what to do with the money. Instead, I wanted us to start thinking about our mission and our mission field. With a bunch of Post-it notes, a giant sheet of paper, and a Venn diagram, we started by answering the question, "Who are we?" There were many answers about family, community, servants, generosity, and children of God. Then we moved to the Venn diagram. The three big circles of the Venn diagram where Proximity, Impact, and Involvement. Because we are a church that feels like family, that is generous and community-oriented, how might we best understand where we serve, how we serve, and who we serve?

With Proximity, I wanted us to consider where we believe our focus and our boundaries are. Almost everyone focused on Franklin County, or more specifically, Union. While this is our focus, there is also a contingency for disaster relief, wherever it might show up. Impact, I wanted to know what kind of outcome we wanted with our mission. What is success for us? Is it helping as many people as possible? Is it helping solve one problem in our community entirely? It is trying to bring new people into our church family. There is a lot of good that can be done in this world and in our community, so what kind of impact do we want to have? Reading through the notes, most settled on 1-3 projects, whether that means a new ministry or supporting ongoing projects in our community. While some did say to try and help as many different organizations as possible. Lastly, we discussed involvement. How involved do we want to be in the process? What kind of funding, volunteers, staff, relationships, additional grants, or partnerships are we willing to explore? Do we want to do everything in-house? Do our demographics support what we want to accomplish? While there are concerns about an aging congregation and our ability to rally a new volunteer core, there seems to be a desire to be involved in the process going forward. Whatever we do, we want to build relationships with the community and be



Zion UCC Church Council met on Monday June 16 2025 with the following in attendance: Fern Dewert, Connie Thompson, Paul Brinker, Brad Parker, Kathy Reed, BJ Cooper, Norma Kern, Donna Bocklage, Bruce Templer, and Barb Cox.

Paul opened with a prayer and Fern called the meeting to order.

Consensus Agenda:

- Minutes of the May Church Council meeting were approved as printed.
- Special Congregational Meeting Minutes were approved as printed.
- Pastor's Report was approved as printed.

- Minister to Youth & Family Ministries
 Report was approved as printed.
- Final Financial Reports for May were approved as presented.
- The council will not meet in July. The next meeting will be on Monday, August 25th which will be after both round table discussions.

Discussion Agenda:

Membership Review Committee – will be meeting soon

ByLaws Review Committee – will be meeting soon

Audit Committee - no meeting

Personnel Review Committee – The committee is reviewing the draft of the Employee Handbook and will meet soon to discuss changes to the handbook.

Leadership Development Committee – The committee is working on securing people to serve on the church council.

Properties Committee – There was no report on the improvements/repairs to the fellowship hall

Safety Committee – One bid has been received for new security cameras. The committee is waiting on a second bid. Council had questions which will be taken back to the safety committee.

Finance Committee – The Finance Committee met and made the following recommendations to the church council concerning the Hansen Trust:

- Open a separate Money Market account at Edward Jones. Motion made and approved.
- Have the fund be called 'Legacy Fund'.
 Motion made and approved.
- The principle (\$1.6 million) will not be touched for the next three years. The council changed the wording to: "The principle (\$1.6 million) be preserved for three years." Motion made and approved.

Building/Contents Inventory – Fern, Donna and Pastor Nick have almost completed the process. They just have a few more areas to complete.

Upgrades to Administrative Assistant Computer and Sound Booth Computer – The Administrative Assistant's computer is dated and will no longer be able to update in October. Motion was made and approved to upgrade the computer up to \$1,000. The computer that is used to record the Sunday services and other special services is also dated and will no longer be able to update in October. Motion was made and approved to spend up to \$1,500 from the Hansen Memorial Fund to update the computer as this is part of the sight and sound upgrades. After the upgrade to the sight and sound computer, the balance (approximately \$150) from the Hansen Memorial Fund will be used for other small improvements to the sight and sound system.

Bruce reported that he, Alan TenEyck and Pastor Nick were able to improve viewing of the big screen television by allowing it to be raised much higher. Thank you!

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.

President Fern Dewert called the meeting to order.

The purpose of the meeting was to review a recommendation from the Properties Committee concerning a quote/bid from Franklin County Glass to install one continuous railing and clear tempered glass to the balcony for safety. The quote is \$13,190.69. Motion was made and approved to present this bid to the congregation for their approval on Sunday, September 7, 2025, following the worship service. The council approved using funds from the Building and Property Restricted Funds for capital improvements.

President Dewert also informed the council that per state regulations, Zion is now required to

have a quarterly oil and grease elevator maintenance program on our elevator. This will be at a cost of \$380 per quarter.

There being no further discussions, the meeting adjourned.
