Special Congregational Meeting – Next Sunday, October 5, 2025 - A Special Congregational Meeting is called by the Zion Church Council next Sunday, October 5, 2025, to discuss and approve the recommendation of the Council to install a new network and wifi system that will be needed for the new security cameras and provide internet throughout the church. AQM (in Union) presented an estimate of \$6,976.90 for the project. The family of Rob Soetebier donated \$1,000 in his memory be used for upgrades to the internet. The Council proposes the remainder be paid from the Building & Properties Restricted Funds.

<u>Informational Budget Meetings – Next Sun., Oct. 5 & Sun., Oct. 19</u> - The Church Council has scheduled informational Budget Meetings next Sunday, October 5th and Sunday, October 19th following the 9 a.m. worship service in the fellowship hall.
